MoU signed between XISS and CROPC in undertaking Disaster Management Programmes

XISS, Ranchi, and its Rural Management Programme organized a Consultation-cum-Workshop on Lightning Preparedness, Early Warning and its Dissemination, Mitigation, and Research-Based Community Centric Solutions with a special focus on Tribals in Collaboration with Climate Resilience Observing Promotion Council (CROPC), New Delhi in its campus. A Memorandum of

Understanding (MOU) was also signed between XISS and CROPC for knowledge partnership and action-oriented activities in undertaking Disaster Management Programmes across the state. Director XISS gave a welcome address where he highlighted saying that lightning is one of the biggest killer disasters in Jharkhand claiming more than 350 lives in the past year, as national data depicts.
